## **County Growth**

- Horry County Census 2020 population: 351,029; Projected 2040 population: 625,000
- Horry County has been the fastest growing county in SC for over a decade and last year surpassed Spartanburg County as the 4th largest in SC. By 2030, it is believed that Horry County will be the second largest county in the state behind Greenville and ahead of Charleston.

## **Timeline of Community's History**

- 1999 The Diocese of Charleston purchases 72 acres of property on Carolina Forest Blvd from International Paper.
- 2007 Bishop Baker begins plans for high school and sets aside 25 acres for a future parish and other diocesan projects.
- 2012 Bishop Guglielmone develops a first master plan for the 72 acres.
- July 25, 2020 First Mass celebrated by Fr. David Nerbun.
- August 2021 Bishop Guglielmone asks Fr. David Nerbun to pursue a multipurpose facility (with gymnasium) for both CCCF and Seton School's needs.
- Fall '21 Spring '22 CCCF's Executive Committee and Building Committee hire The Proper Group to do a feasibility study, Boudreaux Architects for development of a multipurpose facility, and a wetlands specialists to study the total diocesan property.
- July '22 Bishop Jacques Fabre Jeune asks Fr. David Nerbun to begin arranging the purchase of a portion of the diocesan property in Carolina Forest to construct a first multipurpose building (with worship space/church) for CCCF's needs.
- September '22 Finance Council begins and Building Committee expands.
- October '22 Diocesan Presbyteral Council will meet under new bishop to finalize CCCF as a quasi-parish or parish, Increased Offertory Program (IOP) commences to begin raising funds to expand the budget.
- Lent/Easter '23 Capital Campaign for first building project to commence.
